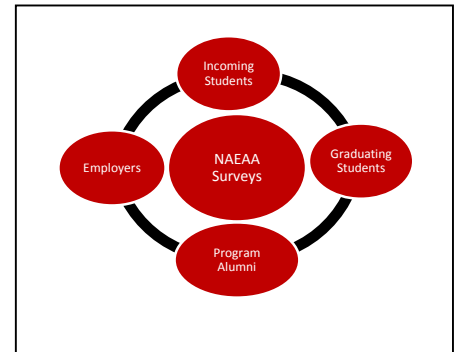
- **11am Welcome and overview of the day – Karin Bump, PhD, PAS, Cazenovia College**
